## AWARDS 2015

### HEMORHEOLOGY AND MICROCIRCULATION AWARD

The International Society for Clinical Haemorheology will present the Haemorheology and Microcirculation Award to a distinguished scientist who has made a significant contribution to the understanding of the role of hemorheological factors in the microcirculation. This award was first given in 1995 during the initial joint meeting of the International Society of Biorheology (ISB) and the International Society for Clinical Haemorheology (ISCH) in Big Sky, Montana.

Applications for this award should be based on a significant published work in hemorheology. To apply, a PDF copy of the work, together with a brief summary including its international significance and impact, should be submitted to the President of the ISCH by e-mail (g.nash@bham.ac.uk) **no later than 01<sup>st</sup> March 2015**.

Applications will be evaluated by an International Committee and the Award will be presented during the ISB&ISCH 2015 conference in Seoul, Korea in May 2015. A highlight of the meeting will be a special lecture and award ceremony to recognize the recipient of this award.

### ISCH TRAVEL AWARDS

The International Society for Clinical Haemorheology will provide **two** Travel Awards for individuals to attend the ISB/ISCH 2015 conference in Seoul, Korea in May 2015. Each Travel Award consists of US\$1000 towards travel and accommodation expenses to attend the meeting. The registration fee for the successful applicants will also be waived and will be paid by the Society.

Applications for Travel Awards should include the following:

- (1) A cover letter, including an estimate of anticipated expenses
- (2) The applicant's current *curriculum vitae*
- (3) The abstract of the presentation to be made by the applicant at the Conference (as submitted to the conference web site)
- (4) A two-page extended abstract of the presentation succinctly describing the significance and impact of the work to be presented

Applications must be received by email to the President of the ISCH (g.nash@bham.ac.uk) **no later than 01<sup>st</sup> March 2015**.
